MDE Francis Scott Key Bridge Rebuild Project JPA Amendment/Modification Public Informational Hearing

Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) is holding a public informational hearing to inform the public that the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) has requested to amend and modify its Joint Permit Application to reflect advanced design and changed impacts for the final alignment of the Francis Scott Key Bridge.

The amendment to the nontidal application and modification to the tidal wetlands license includes adjusting the final alignment of the main span of the bridge, 260 feet east of the original alignment, to avoid conflicts with the large structural components of the original bridge, which are deep below the mudline of the Patapsco River.

The purpose of the public informational hearing is to provide information, answer questions, and provide the opportunity for members of the public to comment on the amendment of the permit application and the modification of the tidal wetlands license.

The public informational hearing will not provide information or updates on the Key Bridge Rebuild efforts.

Comments will be accepted on the Joint Permit Amendment and Wetland License Modification ONLY.
